1. General description of the presented materials

By order N_{\odot} 522 /18.10.2023r. of the Rector of the Higher school of insurance and finance -Sofia Prof. Doctor of Law Boris Velchev I have been appointed as a member of the scientific jury to ensure a procedure for the defense of a dissertation thesis on the topic Financing The Non-Governmental Sector in Times of Crisis for obtaining the educational and scientific degree Ph.D in field of higher education 3. Social, economic and legal sciences, professional direction 3.8. Economics. The author of the dissertation thesis is Vladimir Milev – Ph.D. student at the Department of Finance and Insurance.

The set of materials submitted by the doctoral student Vladimir Milev include documents according to the presented inventory: autobiography, dissertation (in electronic version and 4 copies on paper), abstract (in electronic version and 4 copies on paper), declaration of originality and credibility, reference for implementation for the acquisition of the "Doctor" degree in the relevant professional field, a list of publications on the topic of the dissertation, a copy of the publications on the topic of the dissertation, summaries of the publications on the topic of the dissertation.

The doctoral student has attached 3 publications - articles, two of which are in Bulgarian and one in English.

The submitted materials for the competition comply with the requirements and provide an opportunity for the overall assessment of the dissertation work and the candidate.

2. Brief biographical data about the candidate

Vladimir Milev obtains a bachelor's degree from SU "Kliment Ohridski" majoring in "Public Relations" and a master's degree from SU "St. Kliment Ohridski" majoring in "Production and Creative Industry". In 2022 is enrolled as a PhD student in the Department of Finance and Insurance. He has extensive practical experience in public relations, as well as in the non-governmental sector. He speaks English.

3. Characterization and evaluation of the dissertation thesis

The dissertation consists of 169 pages. It is divided into an introduction, three chapters and a conclusion. There are 3 pages of appendices and 104 Bulgarian and foreign sources are used. In logical terms, the thesis is passed according to modern standards. The three heads constructed are balanced and interconnected.

The thesis and hypotheses are well formulated, clear and present the issues in the dissertation work. The researcher has set himself realistic tasks for which he has selected appropriate research tools. I believe that the restrictions can be supplemented.

The first chapter traces the nature, emergence and specificity of non-governmental organizations and their financing. An attempt has been made to structure and trace the development of these organizations through historical systematization, their essence and systematization, clearly emphasizing the difference between the third sector and the tertiary sector. Their role is also defined through theoretical concepts. A distinction is made between social entrepreneurship and organizations of the NGO sector. Despite the motivation of the PhD student, that social enterprises originate from this sector, this is a controversial finding, since many authors attribute the genesis of social entrepreneurship to entrepreneurship, which then underwent changes. It should be noted that corporate social responsibility is much broader than just its stated scope in the dissertation work.

The second chapter examines the financing mechanisms of non-governmental organizations. Multiple sources of funding are discussed and the fact that their funding is of strategic importance to the sustainability of the sector. The strong project dependence of these organizations makes them vulnerable, and their main objective is to diversify and maintain wider sources of funding. It is precisely this resilience that would position them firmly in the conditions of crises and is an indicator of their significance, function and role. This is very clearly shown by the author.

The third chapter examines the types of crises and their impact on organizations. As extensive as this sector allows, empirical research has been undertaken and the use of a flexible methodology for assessing NGO sector funding has been proposed. The researcher has rightly pointed out their immense importance in times of crisis, which makes their funding essential. Examining them in the context of overall economic development is necessary, as their financing can be countercyclical in nature and have a beneficial impact on the entire sector. Moreover, as the author has pointed out, the NGO sector has a strategic role in providing a quick and timely response to the emergence of humanitarian crises, such as the Covid-19 epidemic, the war in Ukraine, the refugee crisis.

The conclusion shows the most important conclusions of the dissertation research, it is comprehensive and follows as a logical conclusion of the entire work.

The scientific style of the dissertation research and publications is high, but at the same time extremely understandable, which shows the knowledge of the problem in depth.

I consider that the presented material is a personal merit of the doctoral student, as well as the contributions are his. I find no plagiarism. The authors used are correctly cited.

4. Contributions and significance of the development for science and practice

The topicality of the topic is indisputable. Non-governmental organizations and their funding are a relatively unexplored new subject in the context of Bulgarian academia. They are largely underestimated, even though they operate in areas where the public and private sectors are unable to provide adequate and quick solutions. The author has scientific and scientific-applied contributions. Particularly significant is the author's main contribution, namely considering them in the context of institutional and socio-economic variables, as well as the fact that these variables can be social and financial-economic cycles, but also serious crises. A special contribution is the recommendations for increasing the financial sustainability and optimal functioning of non-governmental organizations during crises, through specific proposals for applying the methods of flexible transformation. In addition, in scientific terms, he has offered evidence through empirical analysis that crisis can also be an opportunity.

The indicated contributions bring significance to the development for science and practice and provide perspectives for future research.
